

Introduction

Infectious and Tropical Diseases are a major cause of mortality and morbidity in Nepal. Doctors working at peripheral hospital with limited resources are challenged in its management. Also with development and availability of newer diagnostic tests and drugs there is a need for continued medical education in this field.

B.P. Koirala Institute of Health Sciences in collaboration with Prince Leopold Institute of Tropical Medicine, Belgium and Ministry of Health and Population, Nepal is conducting this course since 2009.

Objectives

This professional training is primarily clinically-oriented and targets medical doctors to improve their clinical effectiveness and efficiency in tropical and infectious disease.

The general objective of the training are :

To upgrade their knowledge and skills regarding the clinical as well as preventive and curative management of tropical and infectious disease in children and adults, in Nepal

To strengthen their skill:

For differential diagnosis by an in-depth analysis of the epidemiological context, clinical findings, laboratory and imaging results, and

For clinical management taking into account the scarcity of resources and national control strategies.

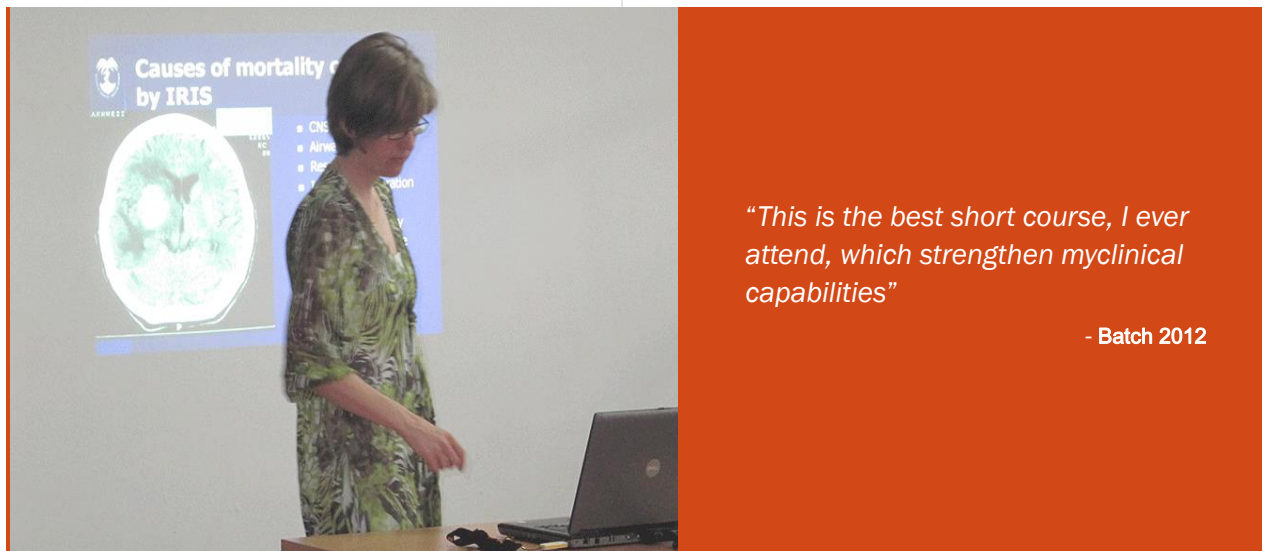

Teaching Method and Faculty

Training Assessment

Pre test and post test at the beginning & end of the training. Thorough structured student feedback questionnaire at the end of the training,

- Hepatitis
- Acute febrile illness
- Vector-borne disease: malaria, visceral leishmaniasis, Japanese encephalitis, Lymphatic Filariasis
- Water and food -borne disease and soil transmitted diseases
- Rabies, tetanus and snake bite
- Emerging infectious disease : dengue and influenza
- Outbreak investigation and response
- Clinical epidemiology and evidence based medicine
